

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE CODE OF ORDINANCES, AMENDING CHAPTER 155 SIGN CODE OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. All remaining provisions of Chapter 155 shall remain in full force and effect.

The amendment to 155.07 Regulations for Temporary Signs or Special Events Requiring Permits of the Sign Code of the City of Port St. Lucie Land Development Regulations is proposed as follows:

155.07 REGULATIONS FOR TEMPORARY SIGNS OR SPECIAL EVENTS REQUIRING PERMITS

- (F) Temporary Banners. A business that has a current business tax receipt and approved zoning compliance may have a temporary banner no more than three (3) times per year upon application and approval, provided that each time shall not exceed seven (7) consecutive days. The three (3) times, seven (7) day period may be successive but not exceed a total of 21 days per calendar year. The banner shall only be permitted on the principal structure of property identified on the corresponding business tax receipt. Banners are not permitted on a roof structure. Each business is permitted to have one banner, professionally created and maintained, and not to exceed 32 square feet in area during the approved time.

In addition, a temporary banner shall be permitted during the holiday season from ~~November 14~~ October 15 to January 2, when they meet the above criteria. Said banners for the period of ~~November 14~~ October 15 to January 2 shall not count as part of the aforementioned 21 day limit.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after its final adoption.

Ms. Huntress stated, "At its meeting of September 24, 2012, City Council passed a motion directing staff to draft an ordinance which allows the holiday period for banners to start on October 15 each year. The last paragraph of Chapter 155.07(F), Regulations for Temporary Signs or Special Events requiring permits of the Sign Code of the City of Port St. Lucie Land Development Regulations is proposed to read as follows: In addition, a temporary banner shall be permitted during the holiday season from October 15 to January 2 when they meet the above criteria. Said banners for the period of October 15 to January 2 shall not count as part of the aforementioned 21 day limit. Previously the code read that the holiday period would start on November 11. For the record, the last sentence in the paragraph in the staff report should have November 11 as a strikethrough and October 15 added and underlined. The Planning and Zoning Department staff finds the request to be consistent with the direction and intent of the City's policies of the Comprehensive Plan and recommends approval."

Chair Blazak opened the Public Hearing. There being no comments, Chair Blazak closed the Public Hearing. Ms. Parks said, "We are now going to have about 99 days that these banners can be up, including the original 21 days. I'd hate to see Port St. Lucie known as the City known for its lavish banners. A group of believe spent good due diligence volunteering to come up with a Sign Code. Over time it has been slowly erased. I have some concerns about this. I will be voting no." Ms. MacKenzie said, "I agree. I will be voting no also." Ms. Parks added, "It's about 27% of the year. I believe 99 days is excessive." Vice Chair Martin **moved** to approve P12-133. Chair Blazak passed the gavel to Vice Chair Martin and **seconded** the motion. The **motion failed** by roll call vote, with Vice Chair Martin and Chair Blazak voting in favor, and Mr. Ojito, Ms. Parks, Ms. MacKenzie, Mr. Battle, and Ms. Skurka voting against.
